


Things to Do

Or grab a drink from Village Table & Tavern's outdoor bar and kick back on the manicured lawn overlooking Currituck Sound. There's even a retail shop with popular surf brands and outdoor gear."

Areas to Visit Manteo

Manteo is a town on Roanoke Island, located between Nags Head and Manns Harbor. Historically known as the "Lost Colony", the area has developed into a charming harborfront community known for a vibrant downtown and scenic outdoor activities. Expect friendly smiles as you explore our local "Mayberry", after all, this is the place that Andy Griffith called home!

HISTORICAL SITES

Festival Park - 27-acre historic site that allows guests to experience life in 1585. Complete with a 16th-century replica sailing ship and costumed interpreters.

Elizabethan Gardens - Fanciful and elaborate gardens with seasonal blooms.

Fort Raleigh Historic Site - The protected remains of Sir Walter Raleigh's 1587 settlement.

The Lost Colony Play - The nation's longest running outdoor symphonic drama, cast on a waterside theater.


(Nags Jead woods preserve

Designated a National Natural Landmark in 1974, Nags Head Woods is one of the largest remaining maritime forests on the East Coast. Explore the gravel roadway by vehicle or bike, or venture through the 8 miles of trails on foot. Along the way you are likely to see one of the many bird species that call the woods home, pond, marsh, and sound overlooks, and remnants of a once thriving 19th century village.

"Nags Head Woods Preserve is my favorite hidden gem on the Outer Banks. From forested ridges and ponds to history-ridden trails met with the best sunsets, this nestledaway nature experience is not one to miss! If you need some outside time away from the sandy beach, check out this spot!"




The main access to the trails can be found on Ocean Acres Drive in Kill Devil Hills. Make sure to wear outdoor appropriate clothing and shoes. This is a natural area, so bug spray, a hat, and sunscreen are recommended. The trails are dog friendly but make sure to "leave no trace." Take only pictures and leave only footprints!





Like Nags Head Woods, Corolla has its own maritime forest to explore. The Corolla Maritime Forest and Currituck Banks Boardwalk can be found at the end of the paved portion of NC 12, just before the 4x4 beach. This beautiful area is the northernmost site of the NC Coastal Reserve, encompassing 965 acres of ocean beach, sand dunes, grasslands, shrub thicket, maritime forest, brackish and freshwater marshes, tidal flats, and subtidal soft bottoms.





"Everyone knows about the 4x4 beach, but the nature walk behind the beach is a local secret! I like taking long walks and these trails are a great place to feel like you're on the Outer Banks before it was developed. Bring a camera because there's lots of wildlife activity!"



There is limited parking for trail access, however, there is a wide sidewalk for walking or biking. If you are staying in the Ocean Hills community, we recommend walking or biking to the trailhead. Remember to dress appropriately and leave no trace. We want to make sure this unique ecological area is preserved for future generations!
